

Happy New Year!

Mike Munro, the North Regional League Representative on the Scottish Rugby Council and Chair of the North Forum writes

Firstly, on behalf of Caley and Scottish Rugby, may I wish you and your club a Happy New Year and hope that North and North East Rugby can flourish.

The end of 2012 was clouded by the tragic death of Dave Mackay, a 1st XV player at Ross Sutherland. Dave died as a result of a road accident after he had been attending his club's Christmas function. Any death of a young person is deeply felt but in a smaller community such as the Black Isle and within the rugby community itself such tragedy is felt even more keenly.

Leagues

Onto happier matters; whilst Caley Division I appears to be done and dusted as to promotion with Aberdeenshire 19 points ahead (despite a surprising defeat away to Strathmore), the same cannot be said about Division II North. Due to postponements before the Christmas break the North Forum Committee had to reallocate the diarising of fixtures so we can get to the split, certainly by the end of January. Garioch, Aberdeen

University and Aberdeenshire 2nds are guaranteed top 6 places but as this is being written before the matches on Saturday, 12 January the other three places all appear to be up for grabs. Clubs are all doing their best to ensure that games are played. If any matches from the pre-split games are outstanding by the time of the split, those games will still need to be played before the end of the season. This applies to all leagues. This is to ensure that we can show to the sponsors that at least in Caley North all games are fulfilled. It also ensures that all clubs are adhering to their participation agreement. However, provided the weather is favourable. the five outstanding matches will be played by 26 January.

Let's just hope that clubs do not suffer points deduction for non-fulfilment, etc

Caley I is of course subject to what happens above in the Championship as to how many clubs need to be relegated. That in turn will have an effect on relegation from Caley II so all games are important which does the leagues no harm at all. In Caley III North there have been a disappointing number of games postponed. It has resulted in matches having to be rearranged for international weekends but again as there is promotion from this league and participation money at stake for 1st XV clubs we must do what we can to get all games played. In other words the mantra is to get the games played! After all that is why we are involved in rugby anyway.

Cup/Bowl/Shield Competitions

In the Regional Cup competition the Caley North area is still represented by Aberdeen Grammar. At the time of writing they have only played one game

in their mini league. I do not really know how that competition is to progress but the Cup Finals day is in April so they will need to get a move on. Incidentally, whilst I have no direct involvement with Aberdeen Grammar, we must all wish them well in their bid to stay in Premier I. Rugby in the area needs clubs representing us at the highest level possible and it would be unfortunate were we to lose our Premier League I representatives.

In the Regional Shield Aberdeenshire and Ellon have avoided facing each other in the semi-finals. Hopefully it will be a North East final next month with a club going forward to the national draw.

The Regional Bowl has also reached its semi-finals stage with those matches to be played on 26 January. Fortunately, our Midlands counterparts have also got as far as the semi-finals. The draw for the North is shown elsewhere in this Newsletter. The semi-finals for the Midlands is Fife Southern against Panmuir and Grangemouth Stags against Harris Academy.

I have also been asked about out own local cup competitions. The Brin Cup and the Referees' Cup will, I am sure, be played for but the Referees' Cup in the North East is particularly dependent upon the 1st XV clubs in Caley Divisions II and III North concluding their league commitments in time for their participating in the Cup. I can assure you that the North Forum Committee is keeping a keen eye on this.

<u>President's Roadshow and Tonga Match in</u> Aberdeen

The Chairman, the President and the CEO and the other senior representatives from Murrayfield who attended the Roadshow in Aberdeen in November were delighted with the attendance of the clubs and wish to thank those for attending for a very interesting evening. I would make it clear now that if any points that were raised, or indeed any other points that were thought by clubs of not being properly considered or responded to by the Union, please let me know. There is little point in my attending Council meetings and not raising

matters causing constituent clubs concern if they have not been brought to my attention by that club or their Forum representative. Your club has a note as to who its direct contact is. Please use this facility if necessary.

The Tonga game, whilst a disaster on the pitch, was a great success off it! I know that all within the SRU were delighted with the support given by clubs and its members. Peter Young has written an interesting article, which is included elsewhere in this Newsletter, indicating the benefits of "Tongan week". I know also that the Tongan players and their management team had a great time in the North East. It will be difficult for the SRU not to take a full international match back to Aberdeen sooner rather than later given the level of support and interest.

We all wish Scott Johnson and his coaching staff the very best as the 6 Nations fast approach. I know from speaking to Colin Douglas at the ticket office at Murrayfield, as recently as last Thursday, that tickets are still available for all the Murrayfield matches. A full house at Murrayfield (like the one against the All Blacks) creates a great atmosphere. Let's hope it will help us to at least get the three home wins this season. Please note that our under 20's will be playing Wales under 20's at the Caley Stadium Inverness on Friday, 8 March with a 7.35 pm kick off. Entry is free and if you can make it please go along. Scotland v Tonga: Community Events

Scotland v Tonga Community Activities

As with previous internationals at Pittodrie, the week leading up to the Scotland v Tonga game saw a packed programme of community activities which provided opportunities for coaches and players of all ages to see the international players and coaches in their schools and clubs. Thanks must go to the National management team for working with us to get so many players and coaches available. The opportunity for young players to come into contact with their rugby heroes is invaluable for developing and promoting the sport locally and really does make a huge impact.

Here is a quick run down of the events...

Community Tuesday

Tuesday was the main day for the Scotland squad to get out and about making community visits. 23 different players were involved during the day. In the afternoon three groups of players went out to visit local schools. Matt Scott, Stuart Hogg and Tommy Seymour were at Harlaw Academy along with BBC Alba who recorded a piece for the half time of their Pro 12 coverage that Friday. The players were presented with a large cake baked by one of the parents, which went down very well with the whole squad that evening! Nick De Luca and Peter Horne were at Robert Gordon's College

watching the S1's go through their paces. Max Evans and Peter Murchie went out to Ellon to see players from Ellon and Meldrum Academies. At the same time around 120 children from local primary and secondary schools came to Aberdeen Sports Village where they had a question and answer session, followed by skills coaching with local development staff and a group of Scotland players. Kelly Brown (who took on the role of MC during the Q+A), Dave Denton, John Barclay, Stuart McInally Rory Lawson, Henry Pyrgos, Greig Laidlaw and Tom Heathcote all ended up with writers cramp after signing autographs for all the children (and most of the teachers/and helpers!).

In the evening a third group of players went out on club visits. Al Kellock and Kyle Traynor were at Garioch where they fielded some interesting questions from the ladies team! Grant Gilchrist, Geoff Cross and Dougie Hall were at Aberdeen Grammar and Richie Gray, Ryan Grant and Ross Ford were at Aberdeenshire. Appointed to the Board of Scottish Rugby

As reported in his leading article, Mike Munro has been elected by members of the Council to the Board of Scottish Rugby and all in North Rugby will congratulate him on his appointment as well as wishing him all the best.

The Scottish Rugby Board is responsible for the ongoing management of Scottish Rugby. It comprises four non-executive (and non-voting) directors, four representatives of the Scottish Rugby Council (and

currently includes President Alan Lawson) and up to four executive directors (comprising the Chairman, CEO, Director of Finance and Director of Rugby).

The intention is for the voices of Scottish Rugby, ie the elected Council members, to have a considerable sway, in terms of voting rights, on decisions made by the Board which impact on Scottish Rugby.

Caley 3 North

Changes to the administration of the Caledonia Regional Leagues has seen responsibility for the running of Division 3 (North) pass to the North Regional Forum Committee.

The contact point for clubs, including advice of non-fulfilment, request to change date of fixture, etc is now the Forum Committee Secretary, to whom all queries should be addressed (details on page 7).

Matters relating to sanctions/penalties will be addressed at meetings of the Forum Committee, under the chairmanship of Mike Monro.

In the synopsis of the last Forum Committee meeting minute it was advised that the policy towards Division 3 (North) clubs would be sympathetic with a first offence only warranting a warning.

North Conference

Plans are progressing regarding the Conference on the North Game to be held in Elgin on Sunday 12 May.

There will be three sets of three forum/discussion groups, the topics including Club Development Plans, Modern Apprentice Programme, Referees with Coaches, Youth Rugby (including Pathway), Caledonia Leagues, Volunteering, Club Participation Agreements, Communication/Marketing. Two parallel sessions on Women's Rugby and Golden Oldies Rugby will follow. After lunch there will be

an Open Forum which will address Funding before the main discussion topic—North Rugby: Challenges, Solutions and Aims. Syndicates from Grampian and H&I will have separate discussion groups. It is hoped that the President of the SRU, Alan Lawson will wind up the Conference with an address.

Clubs will be invited to send up to three representatives to the Conference.
